ABOUT GLOBAL VOLUNTEER MONTH

What is Global Volunteer Month?

<u>Global Volunteer Month</u> is an opportunity to celebrate the impact of people who volunteer and engage in civic activities to tackle society's greatest challenges, build stronger, more vibrant communities and take action that changes the world. Whether through individual efforts, partnership with nonprofits and local charities or through opportunities with employers, Global Volunteer Month aims to lift up the inspiring work that happens when everyone engages in civic service. The calls to action are:

- Recognize your volunteers.
- Encourage volunteerism and civic engagement.
- Create awareness around your organization's needs and funding opportunities.



How Can Your Organization Participate?

Prioritize April every year as the month to recognize volunteers and individuals who do good for causes in their communities, whether through volunteerism or other ways around the **Points of Light Civic Circle**. The monthlong campaign celebrates those who are making a difference in their communities and is an opportunity for organizations to inspire others to act as a point of light.

MAKE A PLAN TO PARTICIPATE

Use these tools and ideas to support your organization's campaign tactics and plan your Global Volunteer Month activities now:

- Collect and Share Volunteer Stories: ask supporters to send in volunteer stories, videos and photos for publishing the remainder of the year. Encourage supporters to inspire others by sharing volunteer stories through their personal social media.
- Encourage Participation in Your Volunteer
 Program: invite supporters to make a difference in their own community through in-person and virtual volunteering opportunities.
- Ask Community Members to Say Thanks: think
 about the impact that volunteerism and civic
 engagement has on the communities and causes
 you serve and provide an opportunity to collect
 and share those messages with your volunteers.

Internal and External Promotion: plan your communications for two phases, pre-campaign March 1-31 and during campaign April 1-30 which should include internal communications to get your organization stakeholders on board, how you'll collect volunteer stories, identify media partners, plan for social communications and a weekly schedule. 
